- (d) What kind of sonnet is Pied Beauty?
- (e) Why, according to Hopkins, does God deserve glory in *Pied Beauty?*

 - (a) State the theme of the poem, Break, Break.
 - (b) Who are the personalities with whose fate the speaker compares his in The Last Ride Together?

- (d) Who, according to Matthew Arnold, are happy men as have been mentioned in Isolation: To Marguerite?
- (e) "He feeds upon her face by day and night."
 Why does the artist do so?
- 3. Explain, with reference to the context, any two of the following: $5\times2=10$
 - (a) Fresh as the first beam glittering
 on a sail,
