

#### THE COLLEGE

Chaiduar has curved a niche in the history of Assam that posterity will cherish in the days to come. Although the place owes its name primarily to strategic geographical location having six routes of entry from the adjoining hilly places, it attains significance because of its existence in conjunction with the place Gohpur, which has been made the Sub-Divisional Headquarter in the District of Sonitpur, Assam.

To address the necessity of higher education in this large area stretching from Buroi to Howajan, the college with Arts Stream, affiliated to Gauhati University, Guwahati, was set up in 1967 with all out support and co-operation from a few humble citizens in particular, and neighbouring populace in general. The college was subsequently placed under deficit grants-in-aid by Govt. of Assam in 1977. Giving further boost to the direction of higher studies, the Science Stream was given a decent start in 1987, and was placed under deficit grant-in-aid in 1998.





Realizing the ever growing need as felt in higher education, the college introduced a few Career Oriented and Computer courses in 2006, and the much needed Commerce Stream in

2012. Alongside this, the college is running handful of courses under the supervision of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) and Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) as partner institute. In addition, our college has a rare privilege of initiating skill based B.Voc. courses and some other courses under the IDOL — Gauhati University. Doing all this, what is sought to achieve is a genuine hub of teaching-learning environment that is all conducive to students and well wishers alike.

As the college has completed 50 (fifty) years of its glorious achievements, the year, i.e. 2017, is the Golden Jubilee year involving various plans and programmes. # FROM THE ACADEMIC SESSION 2019-2020 'UNDER GRADUATE CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM' (UGCBCS) IS GOING TO BE INTRODUCED UNDER GAUHATI UNIVERSITY

A CBCS offers the student a diversity of courses to choose from and the autonomy to decide on the pace, and time of learning. The UGCBCS program will have courses spread across six-semesters. A typical semester will comprise a minimum of 15 to 18 weeks of academic works that will translate into 90 actual teaching days.

#### I. SEMESTER DURATION:

Odd Semester (First, Third & Fifth) – June to November

Even Semester (Second, Fourth & Sixth) - December to May

**NOTE:** Each student must take admission in three consecutive Academic Sessions starting with the first semester. Students who do not enrol in the second academic session will not be eligible to take admission in the Third Academic Session.

#### II. COURSE STRUCTURE

In line with the UGC's guidelines, the courses are categorised as core courses, Elective Courses or Ability Enhancement courses.

- ➤ <u>Core Course:</u> It is an honours course and the students taking admission in honours courses has to be compulsorily studied. For students admitted only to regular course (non-honours) i.e. without honours also have to study core course by taking three Discipline Specific Elective papers for B.Sc regular students and Two Discipline Specific Elective papers along with English-1 for B.A, B.Com Regular as compulsory papers in I<sup>st</sup> and II<sup>nd</sup> Semester respectively. From III<sup>rd</sup> Semester the program structure will be little bit different.
- **Elective Course**: An elective course is to be chosen by the student from the pool of such courses on offer and will essentially be of **three types**:
  - 1. Discipline Specific Elective Course
  - 2. Generic Elective Course
  - 3. *Dissertation/Project:* All students enrolled in an undergraduate degree program (Honours and non-Honours) will have the option of choosing to undertake Project/Dissertation work for 6 credits in lieu of 6 credit Discipline Specific Elective course in the fifth semester only.
- ➤ <u>Ability Enhancement Courses:</u> Ability Enhancement Courses which are to be taken up by students in an undergraduate degree program will be of two types:
  - 1. **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses:** These 4 credit courses are mandatory for every student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program.
  - 2. **Skill Enhancement Courses:** A student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program with Honours will have to take up a minimum of two SEC courses of 4 credits each as part of the program requirement. For students enrolled in non-Honours UG degree program the credit requirement from Skill Enhancement Courses will be 16 credits.

#### **Intra and Inter-Institutional Transfer of Credits:**

The UGCBCS requires mandatory Generic Elective Courses which involves intrainstitutional (inter-departmental movement).

Inter Institutional mobility may not be possible in the same semester. However, a student can access off campus courses online in the *SWAYAM* platform, if and when, they are endorsed and adopted by Gauhati University.

# III. EVALUATION SYSTEM

Evaluation of the student's performance in each semester for every course/paper will be based on the following:

- Internal Assessment (IA)
- End Semester Examination (ESE)

# **Internal Assessment (IA):**

- ➤ IA will ideally account for 20% of the total marks allotted to a course/paper;
- ➤ 20% of the marks allotted for IA will be awarded to the students based on Class Attendance. If the total marks for IA is 20. 4 marks will be awarded to the students based on class attendance. The following criteria will be adopted for awarding marks under this category:
  - a. Class attendance from 76% to 80% ........... 1 marks;
  - b. Class attendance from 81% to 85% ...... 2 marks;
  - c. Class attendance from 86% to 90% ...... 3 marks
  - d. Class attendance from 91% and above ...... 4 marks.

# **NOTE: 75% attendance is compulsory for each student**

#### **Pass Marks:**

The pass marks will be as follows:

- Theory paper: 30%
- Practical paper: 40%

A Student must pass in both internal and external examinations of a paper (theory and practical) separately if he/she has to pass in that paper.

Note: Passing a UG course in any subject does not automatically imply qualifying in Honours, if any.

The following rules will apply for the Bachelor degree in any subject with Honours:

- **Simple pass:**30% to 39% marks in aggregate, i.e., from CGPA 4.00 to less than **CGPA 5.00**
- **Pass with Honours:** 40% marks or above in aggregate in Honours subjects, i.e., minimum of CGPA 5.00.
- In case a student with honours in any subject secures less than 40% marks in aggregate (i.e. CGPA less than 5.00) but 30% or above in the honours subject, she/he shall be declared 'Simple Pass'.
- Pass mark for project work or dissertation will be 50%

#### V. COURSE CODES:

**Department:** Every discipline will be coded as per the following format (i.e. 01 to 99). For example, 01 for Assamese, 02 for Arabic, 03 for Botany .......07 for Economics

**Semester:** There will be six semesters in the degree course. Thus, 1 for the first semester, 2 for the second semester...... 6 for the sixth semesters.

**Course Type:** It represents nomenclature and nature of courses. For example, 1 for core course, 2 for DSEC, 3 for GEC, 4 for D/P, 5 for AECC, 6 for SEC, 7 for P/T ..... maximum to 9.

**Sl. No. :** It represents number of the paper names for the particular subject. For example, in Economics subject, 01 for Microeconomics, 02 for Macroeconomics, 03 for Statistics, 05 for Econometrics ...... And so on.

**Credit:** Credit represents 1 to 9. For example, if a paper, Microeconomics has 6 credit, Econometrics has 6 credits, Statistics has 6 credits. It will be code as 6 for credit for that particular paper.

Thus, for Economics with Microeconomics in the first semester with core course, coding will be given as - 10711016

#### ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- 1. At the time of interview for admission, original testimonials must be produced. Photostat copy of originals are not required along with application form.
- 2. A gap certificate from competent authority is required along with the application form explaining the reasons for discontinuation of studies during the gap period, if any.
- 3. Selection for admission of the student is done on the basis of the result of the last examination passed.
- 4. In absence of the candidate for any unavoidable reason, guardian/representative may attend the interview and produce the original documents.
- 5. Candidates under other Universities/Boards seeking admission in the college must submit Migration Certificate within 2 (Two) months from the date of admission.
- 6. Hostel facility is available for male and female students on merit cum distance basis.
- 7. Wearing prescribed uniform along with the identity card of the college is compulsory for all students on all occasions during college hours.

## N.B. Wearing Jeans and Leggings is strictly prohibited.

- 8. All the students must attend at least 75% of the classes held in a session, failing which he/she may be debarred from appearing for the Examination.
- 9. It is compulsory for all students to attend the departmental, terminal and test examinations. Active participation in academic as well as other co-curricular activities will be highly encouraged.
- 10. Activities of indiscipline like ragging, eve-teasing, misbehaviour, destruction of college properties are strictly prohibited.
- 11. Use of cell phone inside the campus is strictly prohibited.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES

#### 1. LIBRARY:

The college library possesses quality resources in all the subjects/fields related to the present courses offered in the college. The total stock is almost 26612 books with subscription to several periodicals, journals and daily newspapers. The collection for each subject reflects the special interests and need of the teachers as well as students. The library is equipped with a modern reading room with an updated reference section.



The library is open from 9.00 a.m to 4.00 p.m on all working days except Sunday and Govt. holidays. A library card is issued to every student. major students will get two books at a time. General Students one book and H.S. students one book at a time. A student is not allowed to keep a book for more than fifteen days from the date of issue,



failing to which the student will be liable for penalty.

Moreover, each department has arranged its own departmental library to provide the necessary books for the poor and the needy students on loan basis. A photostate machine is installed in front of the library for providing photocopies of different articles papers at minimum rate.

#### 2. CLASS-ROOM:

Healthy, clean, spacious and airy classrooms are provided by the college show that students can give full attention and concentration in the class-room teaching learning situation.



# 3. DIGITAL CLASS ROOM FACILITY& VIRTUAL CLASSROOM:

The College provides digital class room well equipped with all the audio-visual aids to make teaching-learning more effective and student friendly.



#### 4. AUDITORIUM:

The college has a modern ad spacious auditorium with multimedia facilities for all kinds of cultural and academic functions. #### 16. COLLEGE MAGAZINE AND WALL MAGAZINE:

It is released annually edited by the college magazine secretary and guided by the members of the members of the magazine committee. This magazine basically emphasises on literary flair and designing graphics of students in Assamese, English language.
