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## Editorial

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Damdama College established on the 9<sup>th</sup> of August, 1978 has been performing a critically significant role of imparting value based education to its students. As part of its mission to develop a rounded knowledge platform, it has embarked upon a series of 'outreach programs' that engages the institution with the larger community. Event Management, drama workshops, cleanliness drives, Games & Sports, Yoga, Self-defense Programme etc. while catering to idea of 'sustainable development,' as part of United Nation's Millennium Development goals, seeks to build citizens who are aware of their 'now' and the 'future.'

Such a future has to be safeguarded against 'carbon footprints' and plastic misuse, our salvation is to plant trees for improved environment mapping. A green world is the best gift we can give the future generations and could be linked to cleanliness or 'Swachata' as part of personal hygiene. Meshed with the Yogic discipline of 'yum' 'niyam' 'asana,' 'pranayam' and 'samadhi,' etc., the focus on individual 'shuddhi' or purification, translates to freedom from greed, over-eating, jealousy etc. It is also denominator of individual actions, so that not even the weakest individual is harmed. This was also Gandhi's idea of honesty, the maximization of personal purity, as catalyst of social transformation.

Other relevant goals include building of special competencies in a networked world and calls for responsibility towards our fellow citizens. The empowerment of girl child is an important part of any growth paradigm. But age old superstitions, especially the branding of women as witches,

challenge such freedoms and have sinister economic motives. Birubala Rabha's crusade against such false gods is proof that 'women are not born witches' and that their strength adds to the well being of our society as a whole. Both government and non-governmental intervention is necessary more than ever if such equitable growth is to be consummated. Simultaneously, retention of cultural memories is possible in drama and recitation of 'texts' both oral and written. The idea is to 'imagine' communities, while acknowledging confrontation in a politically and technologically changed world, elaborated by Mrs. Firoza Begum, noted theater and film personality. While, such changes require curriculum modification, the importance of examinations cannot be underscored.

This fact was emphasized by Dr. Debahari Talukdar in his lecture on 'Semester System.' The importance of regular study and preparedness for examination, central to this system requires a high level of academic commitment both by faculties and students alike. As evaluations start from the very first day at college itself, students need to visit libraries, complete their home-assignments, and appear for their sessional examinations or departmental mock-tests. On the part of the institution, this translates to infrastructural improvement and aligning curriculum with newer socio-political and ethnic challenges as also an awareness of cultural affiliations and interruptions. While Damdama College is working on structural modification and co-operation between stakeholders, both at an institutional level and at the grassroots, the convergence between academic disciplines and community building is the high point of a 'new-thinking' in education.

## Reports from the College



**Swachha Bharat Abhiyan:** A Swachha Bharat Abhijan was organized at Damdama College Campus on 31.10.2017. Organized in association with the office bearers of the Girls Common Room, this was the first socially important event after College's permanent Principal, Dr. Suranjan Sarma took charge. Dr. Sarma in his inaugural speech spoke on the overall importance of cleanliness in and around the College Campus and also related the idea of cleanliness with personal hygiene. He further remarked that a clean campus reflects equally on a clean society and proves the importance of discipline and orderliness in everyday life.

Faculties from various departments, staff and students of the College offered their whole hearted support to the event and also pledged to honor the visions of Sardar Vallabhbai Patel, India's great freedom fighter, whose birthday falls on the 31st of October..



### **Drama and Event Management Workshop**

Damdama College, in association with its Cultural Wing, held an event management drama workshop in its campus on 13.11.2017. Around hundred students, members of the Student's Union Body and faculty from different disciplines participated in the said programme. Resource persons included Prof. Dharmeswar Barman, Prof. Ajit Sarma, Prof. Biraj Das, Prof. Altaf Hussain and Prof. Amitabh Chakraborty. The experts deliberated on various points in a meeting beginning agenda creating, responsibilities of an anchor, resolution framing, proceedings, maintaining protocols, addresses, felicitation and vote of thanks etc.

The Cultural Wing also held a drama workshop from 16.12.2017 to 22.12.2017 onwards. Renowned theater and cinema personalities Mrs. Firoza Begum and Mr. Amar Nath initiated the students and participants on various aspects of dramatic theory and performance. The experts outlined a programme of training, beginning with physical

fitness, facial and voice modulation, the creation of 'dramatis personae' and importance of 'recitation, 'meditation' and bodily expression. The experts also recommended training in dance for improved audience engagement. Mrs. Begum opined that 'drama reflects the hidden life of a society' and asked the organizers to attract more young minds to drama. The programme ended with a mock performance by the students. The Prize distribution ceremony was presided over by Prof. Ajit Kumar Sarma, Department of Political Science of the College. Dr. Sabitry Saikia expressed hopes that such workshops will encourage students to perform better in their academics, while Prof Anil Das from the Department of Political Science also hoped that such workshops help students engage better with their curriculum.

## Sports and Cultural Activities



The college undertook some special initiatives to encourage the sporting talents from among the students of the college. Selected students from various disciplines were trained in 'kabbadi,' 'football,'

'volleyball' and cricket etc. A high point of these activities was training in self-defense imparted by Sifu Dharmeswar Haloi, an international Kung-fu player of repute. Mr. Haloi instructed the girl students in particular and explained how they could keep themselves fit and running.



Elaborating on the bad habits of 'gutkha' etc., he requested students to abstain themselves from the same. Physical exercises, he said not only improved mind-body co-ordination but also help in fighting much of social wrongs and imbalances. He hoped that more of these programmes will be conducted in the future for better health and safety of students.

The Game-in-Charge, Prof Gopal Kalita, took personal initiative to train up the students. Under his guidance, the Damdama College Cricket Team won accolades at an inter-college cricket tournament held at Mirza. The Kabbadi team (both boys and girls) proved their merit at a Gauhati University sponsored Inter College Kabbadi Tournament, held at Suren Das College, Hajo. Faculties and students were also engaged in a Carom Competition.

### **Competence Building**

On the 20th of December, 2017, members of the College Management Committee, held a competence building workshop for the benefit of the staff and office staff of the college. Dr. Guruprasad Khatoniar, Academic Registrar, Gauhati University was the invited guest of honor for this function. Dr. Khatoniar spoke on 'Digital India' and drew attention to the relevance of internet and the world-wide web in enhancing information and knowledge perspective of students and faculties alike. Member of the Hon'ble Governing Body, Dr. Basanta Kumar Das shared his rich experience on various official protocols with employees of the College. Addressing the officials in particular, he instructed them on the best practices on 'record keeping', maintenance of

'file entries', accountant and financial data maintenance. An important part of the programme was hands on experience delivered by the resource person, who said that like all machineries, record keeping was vital to the proper functioning of any institution.

## Road Safety Day



Damdama College organized a Road Safety Day on the 9<sup>th</sup> November, 2017 in joint collaboration with the Faculty of Social Sciences and Students Union of the College. The aim of the programme was to make students and people passing the Hajo Nalbari Road aware of the implications of fast driving and ways to ensure safety and security to fellow citizens. The programme was presided over by Dr. Suranjan Sarma, Principal of the College. The Chief Guest for this purpose was the Additional Deputy Commissioner, Kamrup Mr. Gunajit Roy Choudhury. In his valuable speech, Mr. Ray Choudhury advised students to start for their institutions and schools early to avoid getting injured on the roads. While he admitted that many roads in and around the area have been broadened or newly constructed, he expected more such facilities to add to the overall safety for citizens.

The invited speaker for the event, Mr. Probir Bihari Das advised the students to be more careful while on the streets and to take up issue of their individual safety in their own hands. Among the many causes he enumerated that caused accidents were: drinking while driving, not using seat belts, not using helmets and ignorance of traffic rules and regulations. Mr. Kamal Baruah, Hajo Circle Officer also spoke on the occasion and advised students and citizens of being more careful on the roads. The Vice Principal of the College, Mr. Dharmeswar Barman also spoke on the occasion and advised his colleagues and students from the institution to distribute brochures pertaining to road safety among people passing by the road. Mrs. Manju Das, Assistant Professor in Assamese offered her vote of thanks. Prof. Ajit Kumar Sharma and Prof. Amitabh Chakraborty supervised the entire event.

### Lecture on Solid Wastes



A lecture on 'Solid Wastes: Source, Affects & Our Role in its Management' was organized by Damdama College with sincere effort

of coordinator, Environment Studies Mr. Rajib Mahanta, Asst. Prof. Economics Department on 17.02.2018. The invited speaker for this event was Dr. Amarjyoti Kashyap, President and Chief Functionary, ENVIRON, an NGO, working in the North East in the field of sustainable development. The function was inaugurated by Dr. Suranjan

Sarma, Principal of the College and attended by the Vice Principal, Mr. Dharmeswar Barman along with other faculty members and students from the institution and nearby. The occasion started with a beautiful violin rendition by Ms. Shraddha Sarma, Faculty member from the Department of Economics. In his speech, Dr. Suranjan Sarma drew attention to various initiatives of the Government of India and Assam towards this very important area of global concern and he proposed both personal and societal commitment to monitor and solve this issue.

In his lecture, Dr. Kashyap differentiated solid wastes into two categories-bio-degradable and non-biodegradable wastes. Again, he said there are several varieties in the category of the non-biodegradables-like plastic, paper, metal rubbish etc. It is difficult to estimate the size of the bio-degradable wastes because of its variability over time.

Dr. Kashyap outlined the dangers of 'solid waste' and its potential in spreading diseases because of its interaction with the environment. It is also dangerous to put away bio-degradable wastes in non bio-degradable materials because plastics etc prevent the assimilation of such wastes and lead to 'contamination' of ground water and leads to the production of methane, which is responsible for global warming. In order to rid the environment of such eventualities, he suggested several important ways out:

1. Bio-degradable and non-biodegradable wastes should be separated and categorized at the source or origin.
2. The bio-degradable materials could be used for creating vermi compost non-chemical pesticides. ENVIRON has developed waste assimilators

which could be used at community and household level for the said purpose.

3. Non-biodegradable wastes are made of two parts- those that can be re-cycled and those that cannot be re-cycled. Recycled materials could be used to make various household items for use.

The lecture concluded with an appeal to all students, faculties etc to abstain from using plastics as far as practicable. The speaker also appealed for a concerted effort from all quarters to work united to ensure that the global issue of plastic overuse etc does not get out of hands. The vote of thanks was offered by Mrs. Babita Kalita, Librarian of Damdama College, acknowledging the valuable treasure of knowledge shared by the speaker and other efforts of the organizing committee.

### Women's Day

organized the International Women's Day with day long programmes. The Women Cell of Damdama College with its relentless effort and dedication of its Convener Mrs. Pratibha Deka, HoD English Department, Mrs. Manju Das, Assistant Professor of Assamese, Mrs. Babita Kalita, Librarian and Dr. Rumi Kalita Das, Assistant Professor in Assamese (as

members) turned the International Women's Day celebrations a grand success and highly inspiring by engaging the local women of the community with the event along with other dignitaries. The college fraternity also acknowledges the association with Alok De Lite (an NGO for women causes). The event began with a group song entitled 'Swadhinotor Joyoto' composed by Dr. Amarjyoti Choudhury, Ex. V.C. Gauhati University. Prof. Suranjan Sarma, Principal of the College presided over the meeting. The main attraction of the Programme was Mrs. Birubala Rabha, woman activist and social reformer, nominated for the Peace Nobel in 2005. Mrs. Bijoy Laxmi Baruah, Secretary Alok De Lite in her speech talked on the socio-political disparities between the genders, and the need for social awareness in people.

Mrs. Purabi Borah, working with the RBI, Guwahati, lighted the ceremonial lamp. In her speech, Mrs. Borah argued that women have come a long way in achieving her rights, though there was much left. In this regard, she requested all women to reflect on their rights and identities through two phrases: 'time is now' and 'me too'. She also highlighted elaborated on 'financial literacy' and cautioned woman especially from falling prey to unscrupulous financial organizations in the North East. Mr. Utpal Sarma, associated with the NGO introduced the life work of Mrs. Rabha, especially praising her courage. Mrs. Rabha acknowledged the honor given to her by the college and highlighted that education for empowerment and information penetration are pre-requisites to a successful campaign for woman's liberty. "The government," she said has to play a more pro-active role in promoting health care in remote villages, she said.

A poem recitation by Prof. Sabitri Saikia added a distinctive note of affirmation about woman's rights. Prof. Gopal Chandra Barman, HOD in History felicitated the winners of a

debate competition on the issue that 'women are victims of superstitions'. Mr. Swapnonil Baruah, ex. IAS officer related the issue of women empowerment with their financial capacity building. In this regard, Dr. Karuna Sagar Das, practicing physician, now residing in the UK threw light on such social evils as the dowry system in the Indian sub-continent and requested NGO's like Alok De Lite to work more deeply in helping woman. Puja Das, the winner of the debate competition briefly argued that the international woman's day acknowledges the rights of woman on their labor as also right to a dignified life.. Paramesh Dutta, President, Alok De Lite in his comments said that women in more remote areas has to be identified and saved from all forms of social evil. The function ended with a small drama by students of the College.

### **Lecture Cum Interaction Session on Semester System**

Damdama College invited Dr. Debahari Talukdar, Deputy Controller of Examinations, Gauhati University for a 'Lecture Cum Interaction Session' on the Semester



Examinations on 21.04.2018. The session was presided over by Dr. Suranjan Sarma, Principal, Damdama College. The Vice Principal, Mr. Dharmeswar Barman shared the dais. In his presidential address, Dr. Sarma commented on the need for a clear and comprehensive overview of the 'Semester

Examinations.' In particular, he observed that there were some confusion among teachers and students regarding the process of evaluation. Dr. Debahari Talukdar thanked the Principal and expressed his gratitude on being invited to a College, which he said was very close to his heart. He observed that '2011' was a watershed year in the academic life of Gauhati University, when the semester system of examinations was introduced. Initially, there was lot of apprehensions about the process a need to overhaul the existing infrastructure to make the exercise successful.

A period of three years was proposed, said Dr. Talukdar to monitor the exercise. But, it was discovered that the 'Semester System' was a much improved means of judging student's merit, because it hinged on the powerful idea of a 'comprehensive and continuous' evaluation and therefore offered a detour from the annual or 'year-end' examinations. A benefit of the 'semester system' is that evaluations start from the very 1<sup>st</sup> day of academic life. Class regularity, interaction between the stake holders, maintenance of day to day feedback from students etc, library visit, educational tours and home assignments are important aspects of this process. Dr. Talukdar also expressed his satisfaction that today a total of about 10,000 teachers and faculties in various colleges of the state are associated with the 'semester process of evaluation.' Though the system is not full-proof even now, many of the issues are getting solved because of the co-operation of teachers and students and other stakeholders.

Replying to specific issues Dr. Talukdar drew attention to the imbalances in 'teacher's students' ratio, which has seen a lop-side owing to the large number of students who now qualify

for a seat in a higher educational institution. At the same time, teachers and the academic fraternity owe to the larger society a deep attachment for even the most ill-equipped students. Dr. Talukdar described this attachment also as a kind of 'social responsibility' and commitment to humane issues. Yet, the nation requires much improvement and calls for attention from institutions like the UGC, which needs to invest more in higher education.

To the issue whether students can simultaneously appear for their 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> Semester examinations, the Deputy Controller categorically said that this was not possible. Students, who unfortunately do not do well in their respective examinations, cannot sit for two semesters at the 'same time.' Yet, in a human consideration, he said, the Gauhati University has decided to allow students who have failed to qualify in one particular semester to fill in their forms. He advised students to work hard so that do not fare poorly in their semester examinations.

Dr. Talukdar said that 'Sessional Examinations' are mandatory. Initially, the Sessional Examinations part of a comprehensive integration of 'student attendance,' 'home-assignment,' 'educational-tours,' 'library visits' etc. But, this idea has not been found feasible because of the shortage of adequate manpower. Dr. Talukdar advised faculties and staff therefore just to put in an 'overall' mark in the 'marks folio' without going for a 'break-up.' The marks so entered may be considered from the perspective of what constitutes the 'best practice' for the said academic institution.

On the topic of 're-evaluation of answer scripts' he said that

the University has a very transparent marking system and he believed that teachers and faculties who examine answer scripts are never careless as a matter of habit. There may be areas of concern, as when faculties are required to examine a greater number of scripts or even of subjectivity. However, when examinees are 'dissatisfied' with the marks they have secured, they can appeal to the University for re-scrutiny from fifteen days from the date of publication of results. Only after that, if they are still not satisfied, they may appeal to the University for 're-evaluation.' In his advice to the college authority, Dr. Talukdar also proposed that all queries and issues of students should be addressed within the college itself. A simple e-mail message to the University with the stated query may help matters and save the students precious time in visiting the University.

The Principal of the College Dr. Suranjan Sarma in his concluding remarks proposed that a way of two way interaction between the faculties and staff and the University may be allowed and a 'whatsapp' number created for examination related issues. Dr. Talukdar expressed his hopefulness in this regard.

### **Blood Donation Awareness Camp**

A Blood donation awareness camp, relating to the significance of blood donations was held at the College on 14.06.2018. Dr. Suranjan Sarma, Principal of the College officiated as the President of the Session, while the vice Principal, Mr. Dharmeswar Barman shared the dais. The Chief Guest and speaker for the event was Dr. Kartik Chandra Medhi, Deputy Superintendent at the FRU (First Referral

Hospital) at Sualkuchi. In his speech, Dr. Sarma introduced the subject of 'blood donation' and its importance in an academic institution after which he requested the Chief Guest to offer his valuable observations on the subject. Dr. Medhi began lightheartedly to mention his friend and classmate Biraj Kumar Das, who was instrumental in bringing him to the College. Dr. Medhi described 'blood donation' as the most important contribution to the well-being a socially aware and conscious citizen can make to the life of his fellow human being. Going back to the story of Mahabharata, he referred to a conversation between Dharmaraj and Yudhisthir that transpired on noble deeds. To this specific issue Yudhisthir conveyed his belief that help done even to an enemy in times of need is a noble deed. However, said Dr. Medhi, today the idea has changed to donating one's organs and blood even for people not known to us.

The physician also commented that while there are no medical restrictions to 'blood donation,' many people shy away from it, fearing untoward health consequences, which Dr. Medhi said had no real cause for concern. A person's red blood corpuscles have a span of 120 days, after which it is replaced in the body by a new volume of the red blood corpuscles (RBC). At the same time, a healthy individual can donate his blood after a period of three months, though a period of six months is generally advised. The physician also advised the assembled guests; staffs and students of the institution to refrain from 'fast-food,' which he said led to various ailments, in particular to 'polycystic ovarian syndrome' in woman and reduction of hemoglobin. Unfortunately, he said that parents also need to be more equal to their girl children and allow them the same

food as is offered to the male child. In fine, he said that we need to 'be natural and get natural' and stay away from good looking foodstuff in the market, many of which are adulterated with various chemical substances like 'rocket powder' for greater consumer appeal.

### **International Yoga Day**

In cognizance with the nationwide call for Yogic practice as part of a society's responsibility to itself and its citizens, the College invited Mr. Rupak Das and Girindra Sarma from Vivekananda Kendra Guwahati on 21.06.2018. The programme was supervised by Mr. Biraj Kr. Das, HoD of Education department. It began with a felicitation of the invited guests along with the Principal of the College, Dr. Suranjan Sarma. This was followed up with some basic free-hand exercises and breathing techniques. Yogic asanas include the 'Kapalvhati,' 'anulum bilom' and 'dhyana mudra' and especially 'Surya Namaskar.' While both the Yogic masters emphasized upon bodily discipline, they also emphasized upon the interrelations of the body and mind through the concept of Ahimsa or Non-violence. The idea that Yoga connects the individual with community was extended through a philosophical bifurcation between 'Hatha' or 'hardcore' yoga and 'Raj Yoga,' the latter including punctuality, hygiene, and freedom from greed, non-violence and no-theft etc. An interesting idea promoted by the Yogic masters was the interchangeability between the 'Guru' and 'Shishya' so that a student who is trained properly in mind-body equilibrium can adopt the position of guru and vice-versa over time.
